2. HISTORY OF RULE

The Royal University of Law and Economics (RULE) is the first higher education institution in Cambodia. It was originally founded in 1949 as *the National Institute of Law, and Economics*, and then it was renamed as *the Faculty of Law and Economic Sciences* and integrated into the University of Phnom Penh in 1957. Unfortunately, the university was closed during the Khmer Rouge Regime (1975-1979), and re-opened in 1982 as *the Administrative and Judicial School*. In 1992, the School was renamed *the Faculty of Law*.

In 1994, it was named again as *the Faculty of Law and Economics* and integrated into the Royal University of Phnom Penh under the control of the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport. In 2003, the Faculty was re-organized as a university status and named the *Royal University of Law and Economics* (RULE). Remarkably, RULE became a public administrative institution by Sub-decree No. 89 ANK/BK dated July 27, 2007. RULE currently has four faculties (the Faculty of Law, the Faculty of Public Administration, the Faculty of Economics and Management, and the Faculty of Informatic Economics), the Graduate Program, three centers (the Center of Law Research, the Center of Economics Research, and the Research and Education Center for Japanese law), and the English Language Institute. RULE still maintains its position as the premier national university and leading university in the area of Law, Public Administration, International Relations, Accounting, Banking & Finance, Business, Economics and Management.

Vision

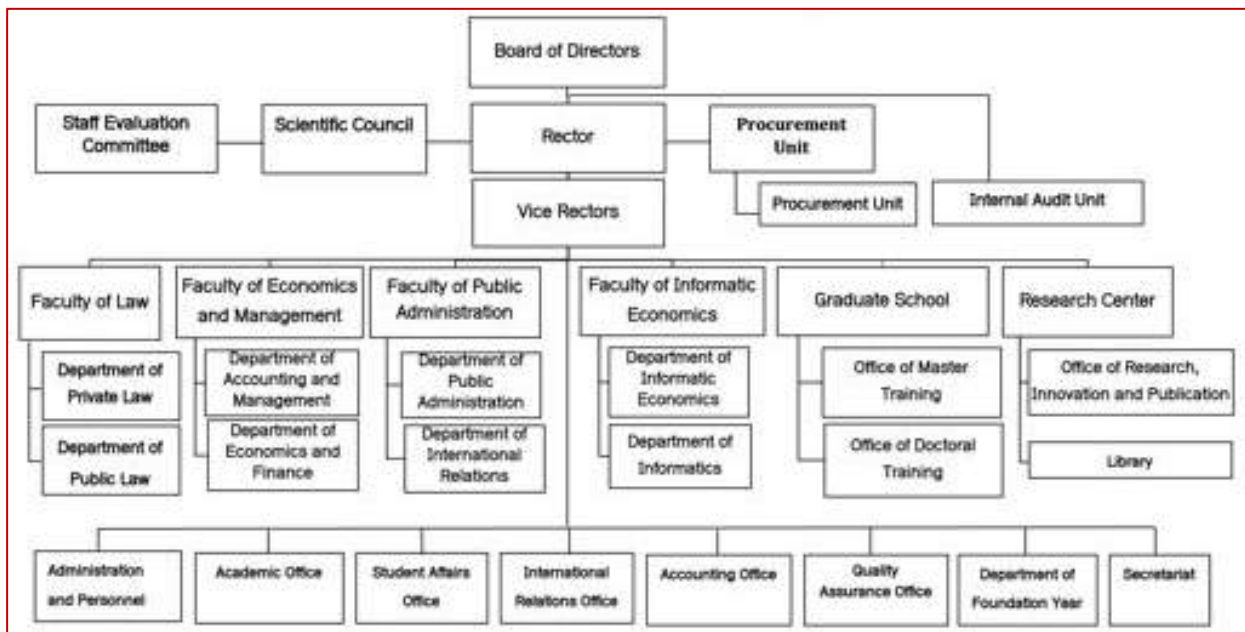
To be the leading university in Cambodia and internationally renowned for its high quality of education, research, publication and innovation.

ELBBL has been working to meet international law school standards by incorporating more interactive teaching methods in its coursework, encouraging extracurricular activities, and developing measures to ensure high-quality education.

Admission: ELBBL is a three-year bachelor of law (LL.B.) program. To be eligible, prospective students must 1) complete the foundation year from any accredited university or a bachelor's degree; 2) pass ELBBL English proficiency test or have 55 score on TOEFL or 5.5 on IELTS; and 3) pass the admission interview.

Faculty Members: ELBBL has 12 full-time faculty members and academic staff, 50 part-time lecturers and professors. All of our faculty members have advanced degrees (LL.M. or PhD) from renowned universities around the world and/or extensive practical experience in their respective subjects of teaching.

Scholarship: There are scholarships for students (provided by Raoul Wallenberg Institute - RWI).

Each scholarship covers full tuition fees for three years, provided the awarded students perform well in class.

iii. Master of Laws (English Language Based Master of Law Program-ELBML)

The English Language Based Master of Law (ELBML) Program is a two-year master of law (LL.M.) program. ELBML is a product of RULE's broad and long-term vision to enhance English language-based legal education in Cambodia toward a quality comparable to top postgraduate law programs in the region and elsewhere. To this end, the ELBML program strives to compete with the master of law programs offered overseas, incorporating comprehensive coursework, academic legal research, moot competitions, and extra-curricular activities. Upon graduation from the ELBML program, students will be equipped with comprehensive practical legal knowledge and skills that will help them thrive in their careers in law in Cambodia.



Tuition Fee and Scholarships

ELBML tuition fee is \$1,500 per year or \$775 per semester.

ELBML also offers some partial tuition fee scholarships for admitted students. Subject to our terms and conditions, the partial tuition fee scholarship covers 30% of the tuition fees for both years.



Admission

To be admitted, prospective students must:

- 1) have a bachelor of laws, public administration, or international relations recognized by the MoEYS;
- 2) pass the ELBML English proficiency test, have a valid TOEFL iBT score of 70 at minimum or an IELTS score of 6.0 at minimum, or graduate from the ELBML Program;
- 3) pass the ELBML law entrance exam; and
- 4) pass our interview.

Academic Terms and Class Schedules

There are three terms in our academic year: Fall (October to January), Spring (January to May), and Summer (May to September). Each term runs for 15 weeks. Each course comprises of 15 three-hour classes. Classes run from 5:45PM to 8:30PM.

7. INSTITUTES, CENTERS, OFFICES AND LIBRARY

7.1. ENGLISH LANGUAGE INSTITUTE CAMBODIA

English Language Institute Cambodia, or ELIC, is an international NGO, which seeks to place teachers of character with a heart for excellence. We place qualified, and trained teachers with a desire to serve and empower students and invest in their future, and thus, build into the future of Cambodia. ELIC has been at the Royal University of Law and Economics since 2000. In the last seventeen years, our teachers have taught a variety of classes and several different degree programs within the university. ELIC also runs an English library above Salle B where students can come five days a week to study and do homework, read books, or use the computers.



Currently there are eight teachers on staff with ELIC at RULE, and those teachers teach in classes ranging from Foundation Year English to Academic Writing in the International Relations program. The teachers on staff with ELIC also assist the university with the creation, administration, and grading of scholarship and exchange program qualification exams. The teachers also run several clubs and host several English speaking events throughout the academic year.

Talk With Our Teachers

Jessica Young was part of the original group of teachers that came with ELIC to RULE's campus seventeen years ago. This is what she had to say about the changes to RULE, and students' motivation through the years:



"In the year 2000, there were six teachers, and we taught upper class men. RULE didn't have a lot of structure yet. At the time there were only those two front buildings and salle B, and the canteen was a little shack in the back. The school flooded often, so we didn't have class a lot. I think that back then the students were more eager and motivated than students are now. They thought that their future was determined by learning English.

"I taught again at RULE in 2004-2006. Then we were teaching listening and speaking to first year students, and writing to second year students. The school had expanded a bit and students were very eager then as well. Teachers were also really respected and students were hungry to learn English. They saw that if they didn't learn English they weren't going to get a good job.

"Now in 2017, I would say students aren't as motivated. There are some that are very motivated in our classes, but Foundation year is different. Students have a different mindset something like, 'Yes English will help me get a job, but I already know a lot, so I don't really know if I need you [the teacher].'"



Joey Garcia has been teaching at RULE for the past four years, and currently is in charge of the ELJC teachers on campus. When asked about the relationship between RULE and ELJC, and teaching Khmer students this is what he has to say:

"RULE and ELJC have been working closely for over 16 years to provide students with quality English teaching. RULE provides ELJC teachers with the materials and environment they need to teach and serve students to the best of their abilities. They are friendly and quick to assist in any way they can.

"Currently, apart from the courses they teach, ELJC offers outside help and opportunity for learning to students in a variety of forms. They provide an English conversation club where students can practice talking about different topics, gaining confidence and working on pronunciation and vocab use. They also provide a newspaper club where students are exposed to journalistic

writing, embrace the process of writing an article, and publish a student-driven English newspaper. They further host events such as English Night Live, Christmas Jubilee, and the Annual Public Speaking Competition. Through these clubs and events, ELJC hopes to foster an environment of learning, promote academic excellence, and build learner community and identity.

My favorite thing about teaching Khmer students is their motivation. Over the past four years, I have met some incredible students with ambition and passion. These students come from many different backgrounds each with unique backgrounds. Some have faced hardships, some are overcoming difficulties, and some are hungry for the future. They bring this energy and hope into class. They recognize that learning happens both inside and outside the classroom. They take what they learn and they practice it, above and beyond expectation. They pursue further opportunities to grow through seminars, conferences, clubs, and research. They understand the important role their education plays in their future, their family's future, and their country's future. They are humble, warm, beautiful people and they are inspiring.

Hear From Our Students

We asked our students what it was like to study with a native English speaker, and how they would describe the experience to someone who has never studied with a native speaker. This is what several students had to say:

"Studying with a native speakers is the best way to learn the language. Native speakers not only teach and explain something really clearly to us, but also show us how to use it. They use a lot of activities that might seem strange, but they are fun and let us learn well. There is also a cultural difference, that we can learn from and use to interact with other foreigners.



"A native speaker is able to tell me what my mistakes are and how to best fix them. Native speakers teach differently. They have rules and lesson plans. They teach very clearly and make it easy to understand. They have standards like no cheating, no discussing or looking around during the exam. We [the students] respect them because they will enforce their rules.

"Native speakers are prepared to teach their students and they create a different atmosphere in the class. There are more activities in the class. We work with partners or different people the class rather than on our own. We do more teamwork based activities. Even the homework we have. While it might be a lot, it is given to help improve our ability to study English. It is hard for the first time, but you will get use to it. Also it will improve your speaking, so if you start starting with a native speaker it will affect your future. Experience it now, to help prepare for your future."

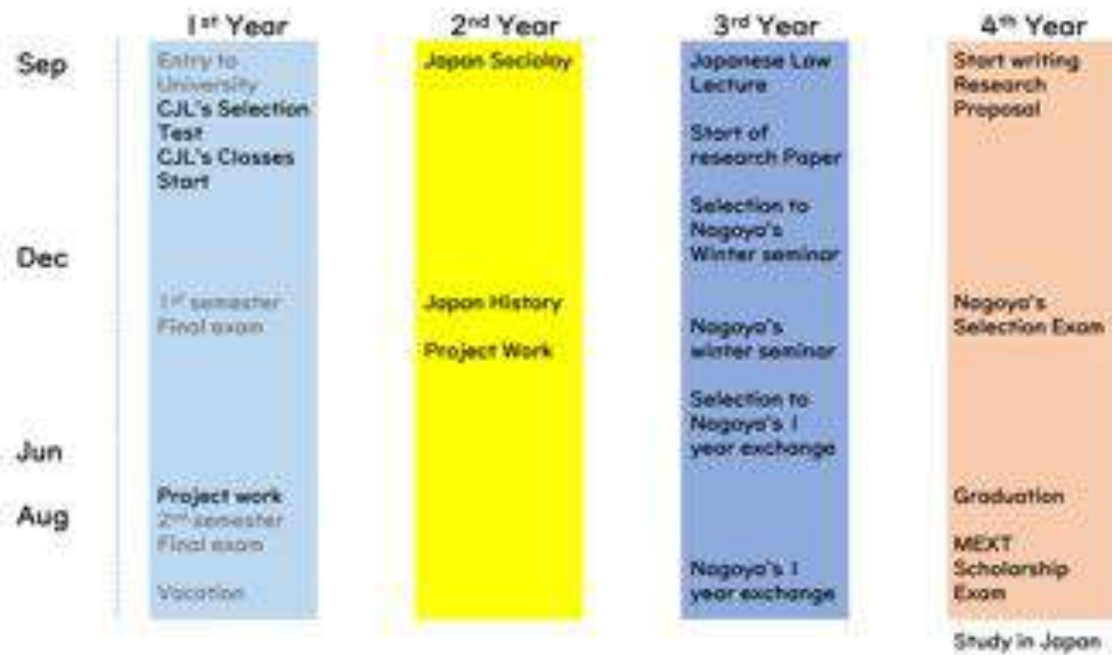

7.4. CENTER FOR THE STUDY OF HUMANITARIAN LAW

Center for the Study of Humanitarian Law (CSHL) was established in August 2014. CSHL is an independent and non-monitoring university-based research center attached to the English Language Based Bachelor of Law program (ELBBL) at the Royal University of Law and Economics (RULE) under the funding support from Raoul Wallenberg Institute (RWI). CSHL conducts and supports quality research to promote human rights and humanitarian law through an academic platform.

Over the years, CSHL managed to establish trust and work relationship with RULE through various academic activities and cooperation, such as research training, seminar, conference etc.

Research & Publication: Having three full-time Cambodian researchers, CSHL has been able to produce high quality research papers published at Cambodian legal journal, academic textbooks, and international and regional journals, such as Journal of Southeast Asian Human Rights; Asian Journal of Legal Studies; Swisspeace Cambodia Working Paper Series; Baltic Journal of European Studies; Journal of Peacebuilding and Development; Nitipat NIDA Journal; International Nuremburg Principles Academy; Australia Law Journal, and RWI publication. CSHL researchers and staff regularly participate in international, regional, and local conferences to present their research findings and establish international networks for future collaboration.



International Conferences: CSHL always sends its staff to participate in international conferences as participants or presenters. The conference allowed them to share their research findings and their perspectives and experiences on various findings, increase their knowledge, understand the research agenda in the region, gain international exposure, and build a research network.



CSHL's Library: Besides RULE Library, CSHL also has its own library to support RULE students, academics, researchers and public for their studies and research by providing specialized quality materials in international law including human rights, humanitarian, and criminal law. The library is working to expand its collection to include relevant academics papers, books, studies, law journals, and other publications in both print and electrotonic forms.



Moot Court Competitions: CSHL annually provides support to dedicated groups of ELBBL students through rigorous coaching sessions in legal research, writing, analysis as well as professional legal and lawyering skills for the national and international round of various moot court competitions including:

- ✚ Nelson Mandela World Human Rights Moot, Geneva, Switzerland

7.5. QUALITY ASSURANCE OFFICE

HISTORY



Internal Quality Assurance Unit (IQA) started with the assignment letter of officers in charge quality assurance in education in 2004. In 2009, RULE established the Internal Quality Assurance Committee to write the self-assessment report (SAR) for university accreditation purpose. The complete self-assessment report was available in 2015 while the Accreditation Committee of Cambodia (ACC) conducted the first pilot assessment.

Remarkably, in 2012, RULE has assigned the self-assessment report committee to write the SAR for the program assessment of Economics in Management conducted by ASEAN University Network (AUN) under cooperation from European Union.

From July 2015, RULE assigned the person in charge of Quality Assurance and directly reported to the Rector.

From August 2017, The Office of Quality Assurance was established and played an important role in internal quality assurance at RULE.

OBJECTIVES

Following the university's vision and mission, the Office of Quality Assurance supports continuous improvement of quality education.

Past Records

- 2007: The Foundation Year Program was accredited by ACC and the award of the Accreditation Certificate was offered.
- 2013: The Program of Economics in Management was assessed by AUN in cooperation with DAAD
- 2015: Institutional assessment was under the pilot assessment of ACC together within 10 higher education institutions in Cambodia.
- 2017: RULE has recruited 12 internal assessors.
- 2018 & 2019: RULE has conducted the training for internal assessors.
- 2019: 12 internal assessors conducted RULE institutional assessment for finding areas for improvement.
- 2021: The institutional accreditation was accredited by ACC.
- 2022: RULE has conducted the training for internal assessors and faculty members on Program level Assessment.



RULE has sent IQA's staff to participate in national and international workshops, trainings and conferences.



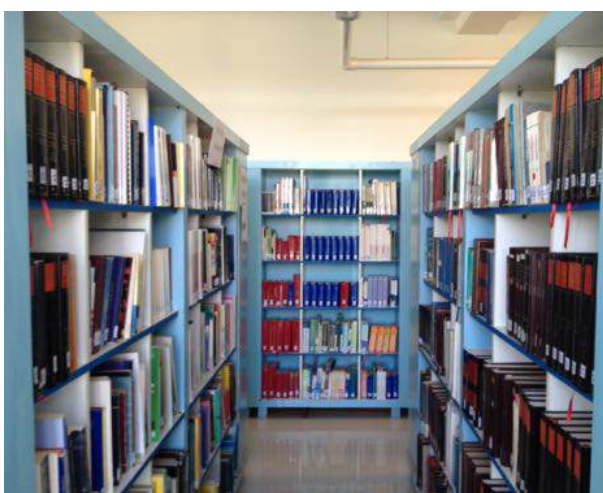
7.6. LIBRARY

In newly-constructed Building I, the libraries are available at the second floor for Law, the third floor for Economics, and the fourth floor for electronic resources named E-Library. Each library consists of around 200 seats. E-Library has 84 computers for students, faculty members and researchers to use.

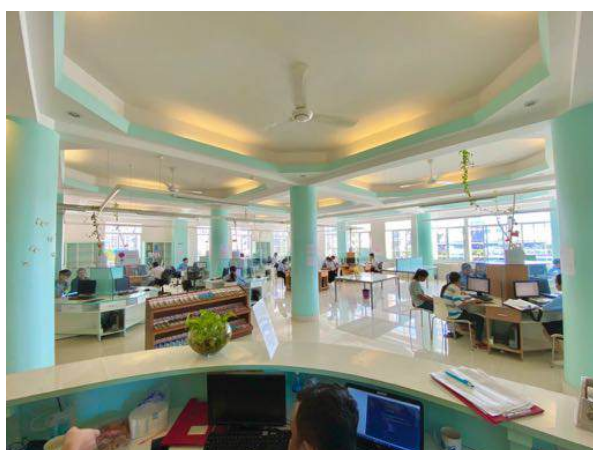
The libraries are equipped with new furniture, bright and colorful book shelves. Currently, approximately 20,000 books and other reading resources in Khmer, English and French are available at the newly built libraries.

The Library Management System (LMS) is KOHA. This LMS is an integrated all library functions for librarians, and students to access OPAC via web base: www.opac.libraryrule.com.

Electronic resources cover full-texts and reference materials available through subscriptions and free online access. The library is implementing Repository Service using DSpace which is an **open source** repository software package

Aiming to achieve the high quality of education with international standards, RULE has broadly expanded its international collaboration with many qualified foreign universities and institutes to promote academic exchange. There are 56 foreigner partners from 18 countries around the world have signed agreements with RULE.

9. FACULTY, STAFF AND STUDENTS

In academic year 2023-2024, faculty members consist of 781 (181 female). Total full time staff consist of 101 (22 female) and contracting staff consists of 87 (40 female). These allow students to learn from a huge body of knowledge.

Currently, there are a total of 18,437 students (9,555 female) in which 1340 (517 female) are Master students, studying at RULE.



Admission

1. For admission into the Bachelor's programs at RULE, prospective students are required to possess a high school diploma or an equivalent.
2. For admission into the Master's programs at RULE, students are required to meet one of the following criteria:
 - a. Students who hold a Bachelor's Degree in law, Economics or a relevant major can enroll directly in the program.
 - b. Students who hold Master Degree's or PhD's Degree in any field can enroll directly into the programs.
 - c. Students whose Bachelor's Degree is not relevant with legal, economics and business education are required to take pre-Master's courses before enrollment into the program.
3. The study schedule at RULE is based on a semester system.
