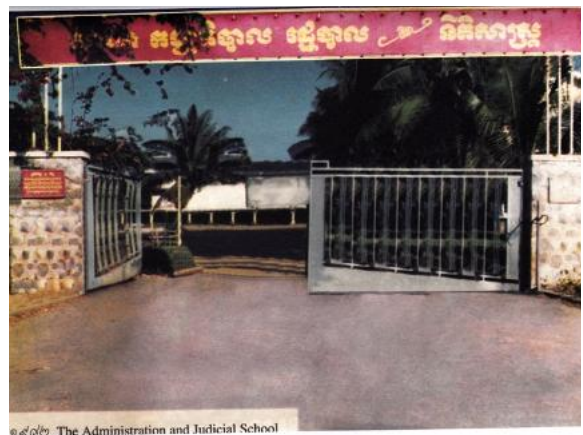

2. HISTORY OF RULE

The Royal University of Law and Economics (RULE) is the first higher education institution in Cambodia. It was originally founded in 1949 as *the National Institute of Law, and Economics*, and then it was renamed as *the Faculty of Law and Economic Sciences* and integrated into the University of Phnom Penh in 1957. Unfortunately, the university was closed during the Khmer Rouge Regime (1975-1979), and re-opened in 1982 as *the Administrative and Judicial School*. In 1992, the School was renamed *the Faculty of Law*.

In 1994, it was named again as *the Faculty of Law and Economics* and integrated into the Royal University of Phnom Penh under the control of the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport. In 2003, the Faculty was re-organized as a university status and named the *Royal University of Law and Economics* (RULE). Remarkably, RULE became a public administrative institution by Sub-decree No. 89 ANK/BK dated July 27, 2007. RULE currently has four faculties (the Faculty of Law, the Faculty of Public Administration, the Faculty of Economics and Management, and the Faculty of Informatic Economics), the Graduate Program, three centers (the Center of Law Research, the Center of Economics Research, and the Research and Education Center for Japanese law), and the English Language Institute. RULE still maintains its position as the premier national university and leading university in the area of Law, Public Administration, International Relations, Accounting, Banking & Finance, Business, Economics and Management.

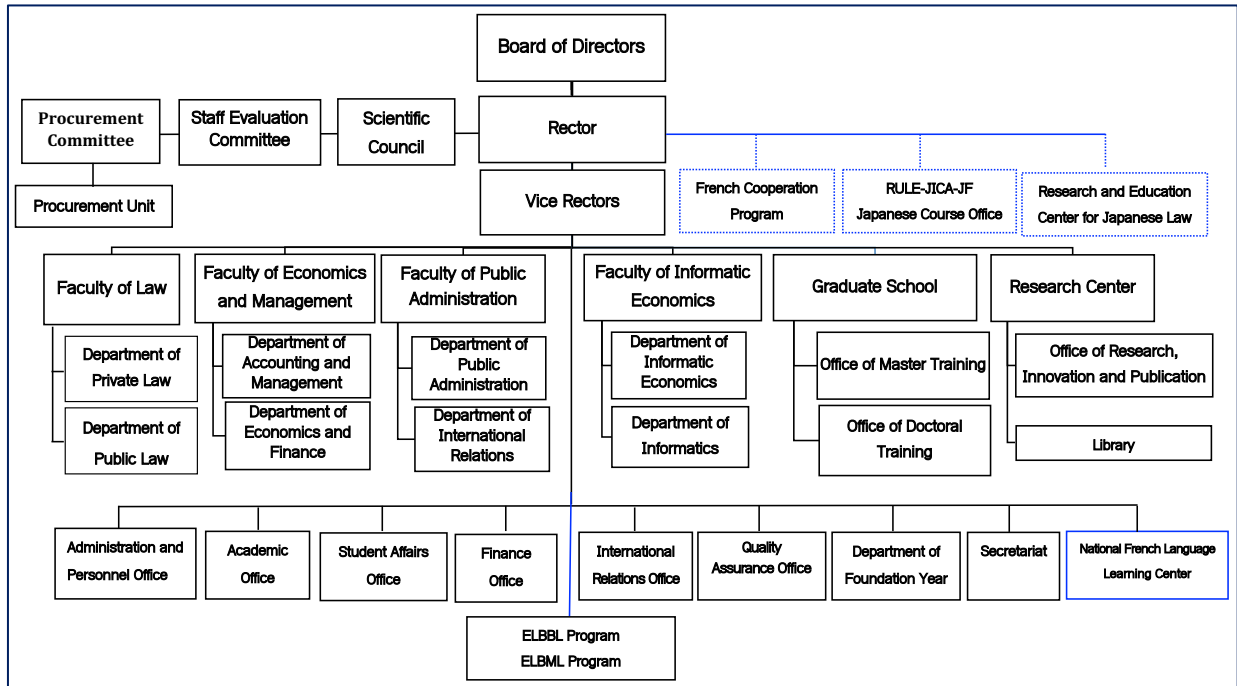

4. ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

ii. Bachelor of International Relations (English-Taught Program)

The Faculty of Public Administration established the academic program of International Relations that is taught in English in academic year 2010-2011. This program is an interdisciplinary field, and it is designed to introduce scientific study of International Law, International Politics, International Economics, Diplomacy and International Institutions, designed to help students develop skills in the area of international affairs. Those who earn a Bachelor's degree in International Relations can become foreign affairs analysts, foreign affairs specialists, foreign service officers, intelligence specialists, or diplomats. The program is designed for a period of three years selecting students who have successfully completed a foundation year program from an accredited university-level institution.

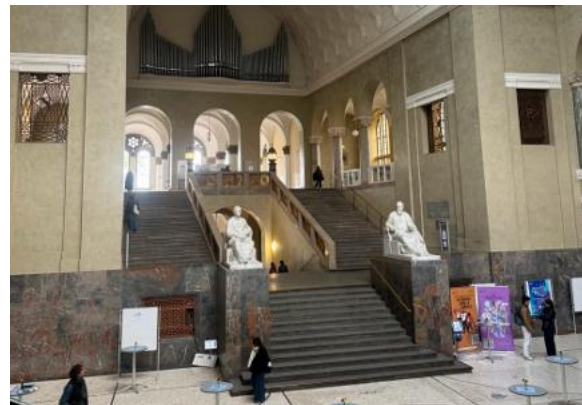

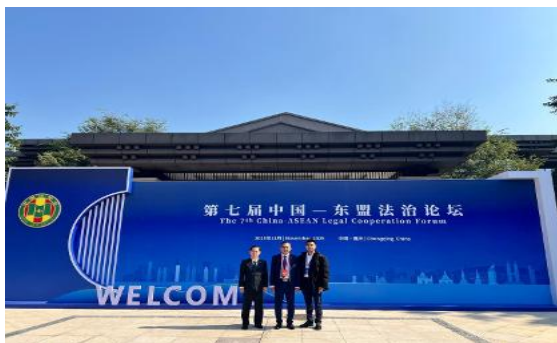

About the Dual Bachelor's degree program in Law

The objective of the bachelor's degree program (double degree with Lumière Lyon 2 University) in law is to provide students with extensive knowledge and command of the fundamentals of civil, criminal, public and private law, in a comparative manner, between the French and Cambodian systems. This dual bachelor's degree, taught entirely in French language, has trained a large number of very successful alumni, including at the highest levels of the State, and naturally provides unique opportunities to its graduates. Amongst these opportunities is the possibility for best performers to integrate a French master's degree in a French university. The pedagogical approach is adapted to the local environment and to the academic level of Cambodian students. It includes a first preparatory year followed by a second and third year, based on the structure of a bachelor's degree in France. The teaching team is made up of visiting professors from the Lumière Lyon 2 University and RULE professors, Cambodian and international. The program is full-time.

About Lumière Lyon 2 University

Lumière Lyon 2 University, a university of social sciences and humanities, has been strongly involved in academic cooperation with RULE since 1994, for training in law and economics. At the same time, special emphasis is put on the acquisition of cross-cutting skills (languages, information and communication technologies) and on the definition and implementation of a professional project (individual support, compulsory internship). The pedagogical approach is adapted to the local environment and to the academic level of Cambodian students. It includes a first preparatory year (equivalent to the year 1 of the French program) followed by a second year devoted to the completion of semester 5 of the French Bachelor program and a third year corresponding to semester 6 of the French Bachelor program. The teaching team is made up of visiting professors from the Lumière Lyon 2 University and RULE professors, Cambodian and international. The bachelor's degree program offers two pathways:

- An English-speaking pathway with all the teaching in English.
- A bilingual French / English pathway with lectures in English and tutorials in French.

About Lumière Lyon 2 University

Lumière Lyon 2 University, a university of social sciences and humanities, has been strongly involved in academic cooperation with RULE since 1994, for training in law and economics. This cooperation primarily consists in carrying out teaching missions at RULE by academics from Lumière Lyon 2 University and secondly in hosting, in Lyon, Cambodian students, awardees or not, of Eiffel scholarships or scholarships from the French government.

6.2. ENGLISH LANGUAGE BASED MASTER OF LAW (ELBML) PROGRAM

iii. Master of Laws

The English Language-Based Master of Law (ELBML) Program is a two-year LL.M. program. It is a product of RULE's broad and long-term vision to enhance English language-based legal education in Cambodia to a standard comparable with leading postgraduate law programs in the region and beyond. To this end, the ELBML Program aims to compete with overseas master's-level law programs by offering a comprehensive curriculum that integrates substantive coursework, academic legal research, moot court competitions, and extracurricular activities. Upon graduation, ELBML students are equipped with practical legal knowledge and skills that support professional success in Cambodia's legal sector.



Academic Terms and Class Schedules

The academic year consists of three terms: Fall (October to January), Spring (January to May), and Summer (May to September). Each term runs for 15 weeks. Each course comprises 15 three-hour classes. Classes are held from 5:45 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

Tuition Fee and Scholarships

The ELBML tuition fee is USD 1,500 per year or USD 775 per semester. The program also offers up to ten partial tuition fee scholarships for admitted students. Subject to the applicable terms and conditions, each partial tuition fee scholarship covers 30% of the tuition fees for both years of study.

Admission Criteria

To be admitted, prospective students must:

1. Have a bachelor's degree in law, public administration, or international relations. Applicants with a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree in other fields must have an associate degree in one of the above fields or have completed RULE's pre-master course in law.
2. Have a score of 70 on TOEFL iBT or 6.0 on IELTS, or pass the ELBML English proficiency test. ELBML graduates and those who have completed a degree in English are exempt from the English proficiency test.

The seminar subject varies each year. Unlike standard classes, seminars offered by the ELBML Program go beyond traditional lectures and actively engage students in a range of interactive activities. These include applying theoretical concepts in practice, developing soft skills, and strengthening communication abilities. Such experiences help students enhance their competencies and provide valuable preparation for their professional careers.

DUAL-DEGREE PROGRAMS

ELBML students may pursue internationally recognized dual-degree programs through our collaboration with the University of Akron School of Law, in the US.

- **Dual LL.M. Degree:** Complete Year 1 at ELBML and Year 2 at Akron, earning a Master of Laws from both universities.
- **LL.M. + JD Pathway:** Complete Year 1 at ELBML, followed by two years at Akron, leading to an ELBML Master of Laws and a Juris Doctor (JD) degree from Akron. Graduates may apply to sit for the Bar examination in eligible U.S. states.

INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

Besides the international academic opportunities available through RULE, ELBML students may pursue a one-year or semester-long exchange program at Kyushu University in Japan, or undertake a prestigious internship at UNIDROIT in Italy. These opportunities are made possible through ELBML's ongoing academic collaborations with Kyushu University and UNIDROIT.

LOCAL AND INTERNATIONAL MOOT COMPETITIONS

Students may participate in both ELBML-related and non-ELBML programs to enhance their personal, academic, and career development. They are encouraged to take part in local and international law moot competitions, including the National Commercial Arbitration Center of Cambodia (NCAC) Commercial Arbitration Moot Competition and the Mediate Wise International Mediation Moot.

About the Dual Master's degree program in Public & International Law

Since 2015, students graduating from the dual master's in public international law are awarded two master's diplomas: one from RULE, the other from the French Ministry of Education delivered by Paris University. All classes are taught in English during week days, evening time from 6 to 9pm. So as to accommodate the schedule of professionals. Over 70% of the students enrolled are employed in major various Ministries, International Organizations and civil society organizations. All classes are taught by tenured professors from Paris University or from leading universities globally. Students who graduate from the program develop valuable expertise in one area of public legal practice, based on the advanced courses they attend and the defense of a legal thesis before a Paris University jury. This dual LLM opens the possibility to pursue a PhD in public international law. The orientation of the program is in international economic law, but also delves on matters related to international security and the question of territorial sovereignty.

About the Université Paris VIII Vincennes – Saint-Denis (UP8)

Since its creation as an experimental center in Paris in 1969, then its establishment in Saint-Denis in 1980, the Paris Vincennes – Saint-Denis university is today a public university central in France in the field of humanities. Paris University has 23,935 students: 15,507 registered in bachelor’s, 6,166 registered in master’s, 1,177 registered in doctorate. With around 30% international students, the Paris Vincennes – Saint-Denis university is the most international of French universities, which has given birth to the concept of “world university” which defines it today.

About the Dual Master's degree program in Digital Law

Created in 2024, the dual LLM in Digital Law is a new program aiming at training a new generation of digital lawyers, in adaptation to the major legislative changes affecting the regulation of digitalization in Cambodia, namely the personal data protection law, the cybersecurity law and the cybercrime law, which will create major changes affecting public institutions, private companies, banks, auditors and law firms. In addition, the emergence of artificial intelligence and its impact on intellectual property also justify the need to train lawyers on new competences. The program is based on comparative law. Year 1 focuses entirely on Khmer digital law, while year 2 delves into international and European digital laws. Year 1 is thus taught entirely in Khmer language by Cambodian professors, civil servants and practitioners playing a key role in the development of Cambodian digital law. Year 2 is taught in Khmer and English, by tenure digital law professors from Aix-Marseille Université (AMU) and practitioners (e.g. data protection officers located in the EU). The program leads to the award of 2 master's degrees: the Cambodian master's degree of digital law and the LLM in Digital Law from AMU.

7.3. CENTER FOR THE STUDY OF HUMANITARIAN LAW

Center for the Study of Humanitarian Law (CSHL) was established in August 2014. CSHL is an independent and non-monitoring university-based research center attached to the English Language Based Bachelor of Law program (ELBBL) at the Royal University of Law and Economics (RULE) under the funding support from Raoul Wallenberg Institute (RWI). CSHL conducts and supports quality research to promote human rights and humanitarian law through an academic platform.

Over the years, CSHL managed to establish trust and work relationship with RULE through various academic activities and cooperation, such as research training, seminar, conference etc.

Research & Publication: Having three full-time Cambodian researchers, CSHL has been able to produce high quality research papers published at Cambodian legal journal, academic textbooks, and international and regional journals, such as Journal of Southeast Asian Human Rights; Asian Journal of Legal Studies; Swisspace Cambodia Working Paper Series; Baltic Journal of European Studies; Journal of Peacebuilding and Development; Nitipat NIDA Journal; International Nuremburg Principles Academy; Australia Law Journal, and RWI publication. CSHL researchers and staff regularly participate in international, regional, and local conferences to present their research findings and establish international networks for future collaboration.



International Conferences: CSHL always sends its staff to participate in international conferences as participants or presenters. The conference allowed them to share their research findings and their perspectives and experiences on various findings, increase their knowledge, understand the research agenda in the region, gain international exposure, and build a research network.



CSHL’s Library: Besides RULE Library, CSHL also has its own library to support RULE students, academics, researchers and public for their studies and research by providing specialized quality materials in international law including human rights, humanitarian, and criminal law. The library is working to expand its collection to include relevant academics papers, books, studies, law journals, and other publications in both print and electrotonic forms.

7.5. QUALITY ASSURANCE OFFICE

HISTORY



Internal Quality Assurance Unit (IQA) started with the assignment letter of officers in charge quality assurance in education in 2004. In 2009, RULE established the Internal Quality Assurance Committee to write the self-assessment report (SAR) for university accreditation purpose. The complete self-assessment report was available in 2015 while the Accreditation Committee of Cambodia (ACC) conducted the first pilot assessment.

Remarkably, in 2012, RULE has assigned the self-assessment report committee to write the SAR for the program assessment of Economics in Management conducted by ASEAN University Network (AUN) under cooperation from European Union.

From July 2015, RULE assigned the person in charge of Quality Assurance and directly reported to the Rector.

From August 2017, The Office of Quality Assurance was established and played an important role in internal quality assurance at RULE.

OBJECTIVES

Following the university's vision and mission, the Office of Quality Assurance supports continuous improvement of quality education.

Past Records

- 2007: The Foundation Year Program was accredited by ACC and the award of the Accreditation Certificate was offered.
- 2013: The Program of Economics in Management was assessed by AUN in cooperation with DAAD
- 2015: Institutional assessment was under the pilot assessment of ACC together within 10 higher education institutions in Cambodia.
- 2017: RULE has recruited 12 internal assessors.
- 2018 & 2019: RULE has conducted the training for internal assessors.
- 2019: 12 internal assessors conducted RULE institutional assessment for finding areas for improvement.
- 2021: The institutional accreditation was accredited by ACC.
- 2022: RULE has conducted the training for internal assessors and Faculty members on Program level Assessment.
- 2024: The ELBBL Program was accredited by ACC
- 2025: RULE has conducted the training for internal assessors and Faculty members on Program level Assessment.



RULE has sent IQA's staff to participate in national and international workshops, trainings and conferences.



7.6. LIBRARY

In newly-constructed Building I, the libraries are available at the second floor for Law, the third floor for Economics, and the fourth floor for electronic resources named E-Library. Each library consists of around 200 seats. E-Library has 84 computers for students, faculty members and researchers to use.

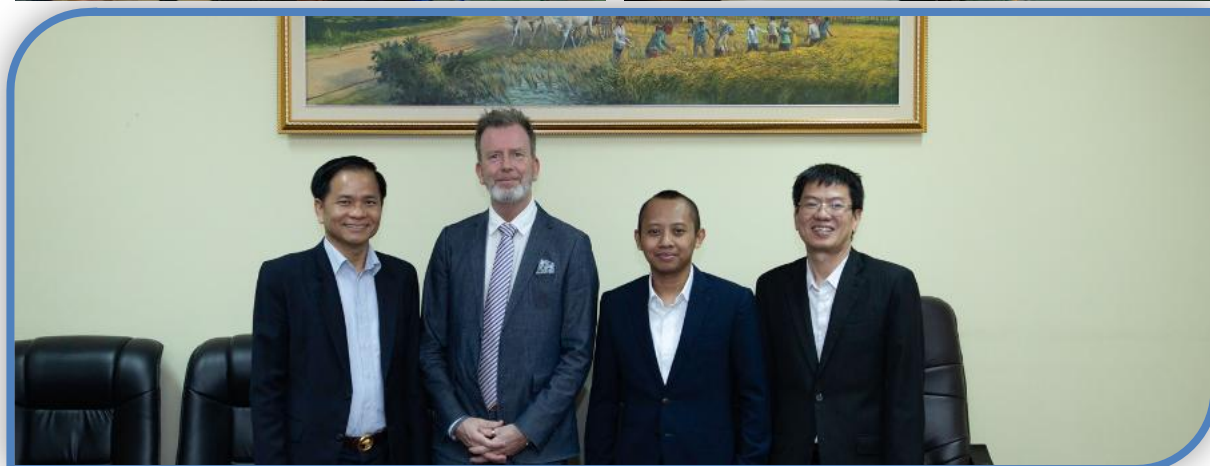
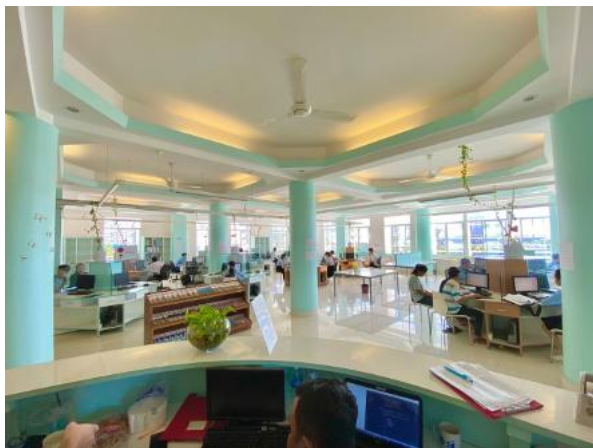

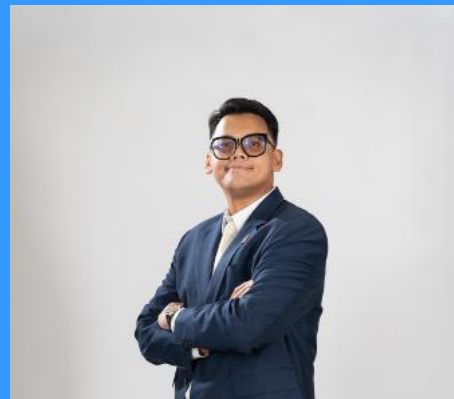
